Pursiainen's publications consist of more than one hundred twenty scholarly and popular-scientific publications, including sixteen authored or (co)edited books, on a variety of themes such as societal security, crisis management, critical infrastructure protection and resilience, regional cooperation and integration, comparative politics, state-society relations, international relations theory, foreign policy analysis, military policy, and Soviet/Russia's history and politics, published in different countries and in several languages. He has also published one fiction novel and two popular-historical biographies.
